Q & A on the Triduum

Q: What does "triduum" mean?

A: Triduum is Latin for three days. The Sacred Triduum begins the evening of Holy Thursday and goes to the evening of Easter Sunday.

Q: Why do we worship for three days?

A: Each part makes sense only with the others. Beginning with the Last Supper through his death on the cross, Jesus gives his life for us. Buried in the tomb, Jesus experiences death itself. In the Resurrection, Jesus overcomes death and makes eternal life possible for us.

Q: Isn't it four days: Thursday to Sunday?

A: In ancient times, evening was the beginning of the new day. So the Triduum ends at evening on Sunday.

Q: Why is it called the Pascal Triduum?

A: Paschal means Passover, and Easter is the Passover of the Lord, his journey from death to life.
